

# Wye Labyrinth

You are invited to come and walk the Wye Labyrinth.

Created in Wye churchyard in August 2018, the Wye Labyrinth consists of a mown path through taller grasses and meadow flowers. It has been designed by Lucy Huntington and is derived from medieval Labyrinths.

The Labyrinth is an ancient pattern that resonates with people in various countries, cultures, faiths and beliefs throughout the world. This ancient spiritual pathway is known to have been embraced by Christians since the fourth century as a support for prayer and

contemplation. There is something in the ever changing direction of the labyrinth path that touches the challenges in our own lives. Walking the path seems to help us unwind, slow down and be mindful of our thoughts and the promptings of our hearts.

The Wye Labyrinth is located in the churchyard to the north-east of the church. To find it, turn left as you leave the church and then turn left again around the east end of the church. As you approach the boundary wall ahead you should see the labyrinth in the grass to your right. The entrance is on the far side, so as you enter the labyrinth you will have your back to the wall.
